



The kinds of Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) which are provided for at Cranborne Middle School (CMS)	 The SEND department comes under the umbrella of Achievement for All (AfA) and provides support for young people across the four broad areas of need outlined in the SEND Code of Practice 2014: Cognition and Learning Communication and Interaction Social, Emotional and Mental Health Sensory and/or Physical Needs.
How CMS identifies and assesses young people with SEND	 Young people are identified and assessed by one or more of the following and as a result may be categorised as having SEND: Information passed on from first schools Whole-school literacy and numeracy screening Cognitive Assessment Tests (CATs) in Year 5 GL English and Maths assessments in Year 5, 6, 7 & 8 (Science in years 5 and 8) Half-termly teacher assessments Teacher/tutor referrals Teaching assistant referrals Parent/carer referrals Outside agency referrals.
